

## ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The Environmental Policy of Medical Devices Technology International Ltd (MDTi) is determined by the CEO and the Key senior management staff within the company

The current policy is as follows:-

- a) It is the policy of MDTi to manage its activities in a way that reduces their environmental impact to a minimum.

Provide the public and Customers access to information on the company's environmental performance when required.

Conserve and protect the environment operating in a social responsible manner according to the highest standards of environmental management available and the application of strict environmental assurance disciplines.

Comply with all existing regulatory legislation consents and codes issued at European, national and local levels and adopt a proactive response in anticipating more stringent regulatory requirements.

Design, operate and maintain all equipment to the highest practical standards and improve working practices as new technology becomes available.

Minimise waste throughout the company aiming for "waste free processes" whenever possible. This will be achieved through manufacturing design; careful utilisation of energy, the use of recycled or recyclable packaging materials which will be used where ever possible.

Adopt the least environmentally damaging transport strategy for both the companies vehicles; and when required those of outside haulage contractors.

To trade with selected reputable suppliers who have met the company's requirements in terms of its environmental policy and its associated environmental management system.

Develop effective means for responding to accidents or emergencies thereby avoiding or minimising environmental damage.

Provide appropriate environmental training for all employees and actively promote and encourage the pursuit of environmental excellence not only within the company itself but also through its suppliers and customers.

Carry out regular environmental audits on all aspects of the companies business to ensure the effective implementation of the environmental policy.

Lessen the risk of operational failure which might lead to environmental damage.
